- c) Brief discussion of MVP Action Grant status (City proposed to do a Climate Action and Resilience Plan (CARP) to set target amounts and dates for carbon footprint reduction for Gloucester, and Define methods and programs for meeting those targets).
- d) Potential Green Communities projects.

2) Discussion/presentation by Byron Woodman of Solect Energy (solar developer selected by MassCEC Power Options program) of ideas for solar/storage projects on municipal rooftops or land to support resilience capability for City operations, or offset municipal electricity demand increases that will come with greater electrification of City operations.

3) C-PACE program (Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy): any further developments on engaging Gloucester businesses in financing efficiency improvements through C-PACE?
